To provide shelter and restore hope, honor, and dignity in every female veteran who seeks comfort, support, and assistance through our programs.



This past year was a year of challenge, a year of blessings, and a year of hope. We have come far in just a short few year of operation and have seen the impact among our community and within the women we serve. We have continually seen an increase in women veterans needing our services or a place to call home. Since our opening in 2019, we have housed over 65 single women veterans, provided services to over 250 women and 35 male veterans. Our success comes as we have seen at least 15 of the 65 women make the transition from unhoused to housed, gain employment and reconnect with their families.

Why am I mentioning numbers, simply because numbers help tell our story and why we are needed. We hope that one day organizations like ours will no longer be needed and homelessness eradicated.

Like any organization in the aftermath of the COVID-19 pandemic, a struggling economy and high inflation, we have seen costs rise significantly while monetary donations decrease. But if not for our community we could not continue to do what we do – “To provide shelter and restore hope, honor, and dignity in every female veteran who seeks comfort, support, and assistance...”

This was our founder’s (Nancy Bullock-Prevot’s) vision, and we continue to live each day according to that vision.

I want to thank all our donors, sponsors, volunteers, and our community for their constant support – thank you for honoring our women veterans and their service. We could not do what we do without you.

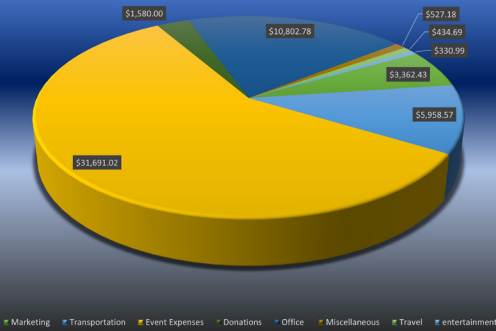
Our Mission

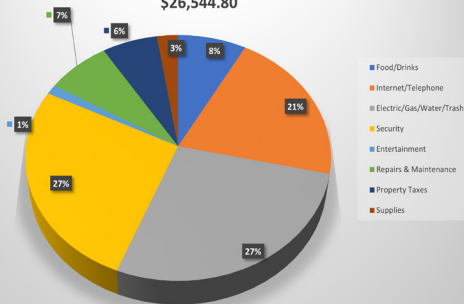

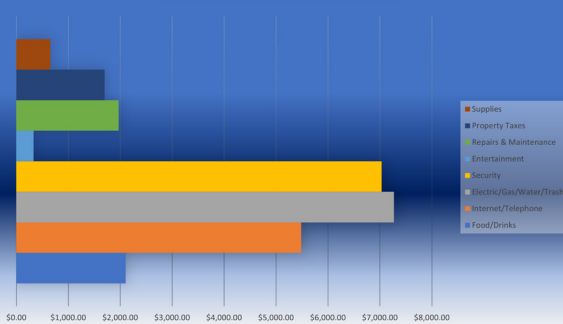


2023 FAITH HOUSE Operational Costs

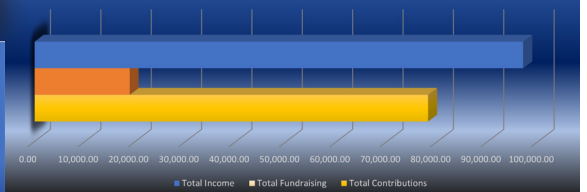

In 2023, we were blessed to be chosen by one of Pensacola's largest Mardi Gras Krewe – The Gatsby Girls. Each year the Gatsby Girls chooses an organization to sponsor and raise money from their annual New Year's gala. After meeting with us and asking for our needs they raised enough money for us to purchase a new vehicle to transport our women veterans. After searching many car lots we are happy to announce that we purchased the vehicle in January 2024. We cannot thank The Gatsby Girls enough for their outpouring of support.



The foundation was also blessed to be chosen by Leonardo Helicopters whom was awarded contracts to supply helicopters and training to the Navy. They have blessed us and we are so happy that they chose Honor HER Foundation as their charity.



We See You Season 4: unfortunately we did not take new photos of women veterans in the community this year so we decided to have the We See You Season 4 as a showcase. We thank our friends at Perfect Plain's Brewery for allowing us to place our portraits at their brewery to raise awareness that women serve too and that We See and acknowledge them.

To round out our year, we held our 3rd Annual All Services Ball at Court of De Luna in downtown Pensacola. We honored military, law enforcement and first responders with awards, entertainment and a night of fun. This year we went back to basics and entertained over 150 guests and were able to donate monies to our two charities: Marine Toy's for Tots and The Secret Place. Conchita's LLC catered and Mario Parrish and the Multishow band performed, and we danced the night away. The All Services Ball was featured in the December issue of VIP Pensacola and Bella Magazines.



Our Board of Directors hosted the Faith House Christmas party where we spent time with our women veterans, celebrating the joyousness of the season. We ate,



exchanged gifts and enjoyed our time as a family – after all we are our residents family and we treat them as such. We are not a shelter but a home – No woman



Our Needs

We are asked constantly what the needs of the house are or what our residents require assistance. The biggest needs at this time is a new HVAC system and rewiring Faith House. Toward the end of summer 2023, our two HVAC systems stopped operating leaving us to purchase window units to help keep our residents cool but the winter left us without heat. It will cost the foundation at least \$20,000.00 to replace our HVAC Systems.

The building we are in was not designed for its current usage and with the increase in electrical usage circuits have been tripping. Our current wiring is a mixture of copper and aluminum with our largest outlet supporting only 10-15amps. Though we do not have exact estimates as this time for rewiring and supply costs we can imagine it will be significant.
